### What About the Fish?

Bob [read the label](#) of the weed and feed pesticide he planned to apply to his lawn. Under the [Environmental Hazard Statements](#) section of the product label, he learned the product is toxic to fish. Bob was concerned that the weed and feed product could move across his lawn, to the stream, and potentially harm the fish. Bob decided to give them a call to get more information about his situation.

### What About the Fish?
